

# The Largest Ballet & Classically Based Companies

AUGUST 2023



#### **Report Summary**

This is Dance Data Project®'s fifth annual study of the Largest US Ballet and Classically Based Companies. Following the precedent of the 2022 Report, the DDP research team ranks the financial scope of the **Largest 150** US ballet companies. These companies are divided into three categories: the **Largest 50** (#1-50), the **Next 50** (#51-100), and the **Additional 50** (#101-150) companies for further analysis. This report is based on companies' total expenditures from 990 filings from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) for fiscal year ending 2021, and provides information on aggregate expenditures, each category's contribution to the ballet economy, as well as changes from the previous years.

It is important to note that this is not a subjective ranking of companies based on aesthetics, but rather a numerical study based on their economic contribution to the ballet sector. The rankings are determined by total expenses reported by each company to the IRS on their 990s.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, companies faced a varying range of federal, state, and regional public health restrictions limiting their return to full operations for the 2021-2022 season. Several ballet companies<sup>1</sup> are also members of AGMA (American Guild of Musical Artists) and faced additional restrictions regarding returning to the workplace safely.

<u>Dance/USA</u> reports organizations lost 75% in ticket revenue and an average loss of nearly 50% in tuition revenue from March 2020 to February 2021. In addition, 82% of touring companies reported tour cancellations. <u>Arts Journal</u> cites that donations in the arts, culture, and humanities sector also decreased by 8.9% in 2021. Finally, federal programs such as SVOC and PPP loans that supported companies during the pandemic expired and companies are facing the reality of the widely reported failure of audiences to return to all performing arts venues.

The decrease in expenditure of 31% among the **Largest 150** from the previous year signals that recovery is slow and the impact of COVID-19 was severe. Overall expenditures decreased from \$646,264,494 in FY2020 to \$441,886,534 in FY2021. Capturing longitudinal data on company expenditures is important in understanding the short and long-term economic impact of the pandemic on the dance sector, as well as to assess financial recovery. Due to a backlog in processing 990 returns from 2021 by the IRS, a further delay in posting these returns and amendments on their website, and the lack of availability of FY 2022 returns, it is impossible to gain a real-time view of the impact of COVID shutdowns. The rankings contained in this report are based on the 2021 fiscal year.

#### **Key Findings:**

- In fiscal year 2021, the **Largest 150** US Ballet and Classically influenced companies operated with a combined total expenditure of \$441,886,534. This reflects a significant decrease of 31.62% compared to the operating expenses of \$646,264,494 in fiscal year 2020. This decline is larger than the 11.07% decrease observed between FY 2019 and FY 2020, underscoring the more pronounced impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the ballet industry in FY 2021.
- The **Largest 50** companies operated with a total aggregate expenditure of \$391,881,659 (88.68%) in FY2021, whereas the **Next 50** operated with \$37,537,748 (8.49%), and the **Additional 50** operated with \$12,467,127 (2.82%).
- Aggregate expenditures of the Largest 50 decreased by 33% from 2020 to 2021; decreased by 11% from 2019 to 2020; and increased by 4% from 2018 to 2019. Aggregate expenditure of the Next 50 decreased by 14% from 2020 to 2021; decreased by 11% from 2019 to 2020; and increased by 7% from 2018 to 2019. Aggregate expenditure of the Additional 50 decreased by 32% from 2020 to 2021; decreased by 11% from 2019 to 2020; and increased by 7% from 2018 to 2019.

#### Year-to-Year Changes within the "Largest 50"

Compared to DDP's report published in 2022:

- American Ballet Theatre has risen from #6 back to their ranking of #3 from the 2021 report.
- Ballet West moved into the Largest 10 ahead of Philadelphia Ballet.
- Two companies, Orlando Ballet (#18) and Nashville Ballet (#22) have moved into the Largest 25.
- Charlotte Ballet (#27) and Oregon Ballet Theatre (#31) have shifted out of the Largest 25.
- Wonderbound (#50) and Collage Dance Collective (#47) were added to the Largest 50.
- Ballet San Antonio, Sacramento Ballet, and Los Angeles Ballet dropped out of the Largest 50.

#### Year-to-Year Changes within the "Next 50"

Compared to DDP's report published in 2022:

- Ballet Sun Valley (#60) shifted up into the Next 50 from #138 in 20218.
- The following companies entered into the Largest 100: Brooklyn Ballet, Chamber Dance Project, First State Ballet, Portland Ballet, The Georgia Ballet, Winston-Salem Festival Ballet, and Utah Metropolitan Ballet.
- The following companies shifted out of the Largest 100: American Contemporary Ballet, Ballet Arkansas, BalletCollective, Les Ballets Trockadero de Monte Carlo, Oakland Ballet Company, and San Diego Ballet.
- City Ballet of Boston shifted out of the Largest 150. They were ranked #94 in the 2022 ranking.
- Eglevsky Ballet<sup>9</sup>, Golden State Ballet, and New Orleans Ballet Theatre<sup>10</sup> have entered the Largest 150 for the first time.

Compared to DDP's report published in 2022:

- Ballet Tucson is a new addition to this year's rankings<sup>12</sup>.
- The Rosin Box Project (#144) entered into the Largest 150 companies.
- Albany Berkshire Ballet, Barak Ballet<sup>13</sup>, Ballet Minnesota, Luminario Ballet, and Savannah Ballet Theatre, have dropped out of the Largest 150 companies.

# **Section II:** Scope of The Industry

#### **Aggregate Expenditures**

The **Largest 150** ballet and classically inspired companies operated with a total aggregate expenditure of \$441,886,534 in fiscal year 2021. This is a 31.62% decrease from 2020 when total expenditure was \$646,264,494. In 2019, total expenditures were \$724,741,470.

The **Largest 50** companies operated with a total of \$391,881,659, accounting for 88.68% of the total expenditure in 2021. In 2020, they accounted for 90.37%.

The **Next 50** companies operated with a total of \$37,537,748, accounting for 8.49% of the total expenditure in 2021. In 2020, they accounted for 6.72%.

The **Additional 50** companies operated with a total of \$12,467,127, accounting for 2.82% of the total expenditure in 2021. In 2020, they accounted for 2.85%.

#### **Aggregate Expenditure By Year**



From 2020 to 2021, aggregate expenditures of the **Largest 50** decreased by 33%. From 2019 to 2020, aggregate expenditure decreased by 11%. From 2018 to 2019, aggregate expenditure increased by 4%.

From 2020 to 2021, aggregate expenditures of the **Next 50** decreased by 14%. From 2019 to 2020, aggregate expenditure decreased by 11%. From 2018 to 2019, aggregate expenditure increased by 7%.

From 2020 to 2021, aggregate expenditures of the **Additional 50** decreased by 32%. From 2019 to 2020, aggregate expenditure decreased by 11%. From 2018 to 2019, aggregate expenditure increased by 7%.



### Aggregate Expenditure by Percentage - "Largest 50" U.S. Ballet Companies

In FY 2021, the Largest 50 Companies contributed to 88.68% of total expenditures of the Largest 150 companies:

- The Largest 10 (#1-10) account for \$225,635,870, or 58% of expenditures. In 2020, they contributed to 60% of expenditures with \$349,991,075.
- The Upper 25 (#1-25) account for \$321,134,547, or 82% of expenditures. In 2020, the Upper 25 represented 83% of expenditures within the Largest 50 at \$486,743,244.
- The Lower 25 (#26-50) account for \$69,379,733, or 18% of expenditures. In 2020, these companies together contributed to 17% of the aggregate budget by expenditure in the Largest 50 at a combined total of \$98,369,570.

The Largest 10 account for 2% less of aggregate expenditures than in the past 2 years. The Largest 25 account for 1% less of aggregate expenditures than in the past 2 years.


### "Largest 50" Aggregate Expenditure by Percentage - Largest 10


#### Aggregate Expenditure by Percentage- "Next 50" U.S. Ballet Companies

In FY 2021, the Next 50 companies contributed to 8.51% of total expenditures of the Largest 150 companies:

- The Upper 10 (#51-60) account for \$12,067,972, or 32% of expenditures. In 2020, they accounted for 30% of total expenditures with \$13,503,779.
- The Upper 25 (#51-75) account for \$24,792,411, or 66% of expenditures. In 2020, they accounted for 64% of total expenditures with \$28,834,688.
- The Lower 25 (#76-100) account for \$12,745,337, or 34% of expenditures. In 2020, they accounted for 36% of total expenditures with \$16,009,974.

The "Next 50" companies are more evenly distributed in their market power. For context, the aggregate expenditures of this entire category for FY 2021 are less than NYCB, ranked at #1. NYCB<sup>14</sup> alone contributes to 9% of the ballet economy in FY 2021.

In FY 2021, the Additional 50 companies contributed to 2.82% of total expenditures of the Largest 150 companies:


- The Upper 10 (#101-110) account for \$3,464,551, or 27% of expenditures
- The Upper 25 (#101-125) account for \$7,685,128, or 61% of expenditures
- The Lower 25 (#126-150) account for \$4,781,999, or 39% of expenditures

The Additional 50 have remained the same in terms of market power for the last 3 years: in 2020, they accounted for 2.85%, and in 2019 they accounted for 2.86%.

### "Additional 50" Aggregate Expenditure by Percentage - Largest 25






#### Distribution of Expenditures by Year

Following the COVID-19 pandemic, companies were faced with a number of public and regional health restrictions that affected their core activities." The impact of the COVID-19 pandemic could have decimated a field reliant on physical connections, public participation and attendance, live performance, and ticket sales for its survival. It very nearly did." Dance/USA.

The following figures show the trends of expenditures with the **Largest 150** companies for 2019, 2020, and 2021. Note that the total expenditure aligns with company rankings for each specific year (refer to Appendix A: Rankings). For example, American Ballet Theatre was ranked #3 in 2019 and 2021, while in 2020 Alvin Ailey American Dance Theatre ranked number #3. In the figure below, the expenditures for the company ranked #3 in 2019 and 2021 correspond to ABT's expenditures, and in 2020 correspond to AAADT's expenditures. The figures highlight expenditures of the industry as a whole over time, over the movement of individual companies' expenditures.



### "Largest 50" Distribution of Expenditures by Ranking






### "Largest 50" Distribution of Expenditures by Ranking - Zoomed In (Upper 25)



### "Largest 50" Distribution of Expenditures by Ranking - Zoomed In (Lower 25)






### "Next 50" Distribution of Expenditures by Ranking

#### Change in Expenditures from 2020 to 2021

The following section shows the individual changes in expenditures from FY 2020 to FY 2021 in dollar amount and percent change. Percent change is used to put the dollar amount of change in the context of a company's expenditure. Only companies with percentage changes of 50% or more are highlighted in this section. For a full listing of percent and dollar changes in expenditures for all companies, refer to Appendix B - Change in Expenditures from 2020 to 2021.

#### Largest 50 - Change in Expenditures from 2020 to 2021

From FY 2020 to FY 2021, 5 companies increased expenditures, and 45 companies decreased expenditures.

- One company's expenditures increased by more than 50%: Collage Dance Collective (50.49%).
- Two companies' expenditures decreased by more than 50%: New York City Ballet (-51.41%), and Oregon Ballet Theatre (-52.24%).

#### Next 50 - Change in Expenditures from 2020 to 2021

From FY 2020 to FY 2021, 15 companies increased expenditures, and 34 companies decreased expenditures.

- Four companies' expenditures increased by more than 50%: Ballet Sun Valley (364.56%), Mystic Ballet (190.03%), New Orleans Ballet Theatre (108.04%), Chamber Dance Project (100.58%), and Brooklyn Ballet (63.57%).
- Three companies' expenditures decreased by more than 50%: Maine State Ballet (-53.15%), Sacramento Ballet (-54.39%), and Los Angeles Ballet (-69.05%).

#### Additional 50 - Change in Expenditures from 2020 to 2021

From FY 2020 to FY 2021, 13 companies increased expenditures, and 37 companies decreased expenditures.

- Four companies' expenditures increased by more than 50%: The Rosin Box Project (185.69%), Dimensions Dance Theatre of Miami (103.74%), New York Dance Project (88.27%), and Texture Contemporary Ballet (68.03%).
- Eleven companies' expenditures decreased by more than 50%: Moveius Contemporary Ballet (-50.39%), Peninsula Ballet Theatre (-50.95%), Menlowe Ballet (-52.37%), Carolina Ballet Theatre (55.12%), Armitage Gone! Dance (-60.51%), Les Ballets Trockadero de Monte Carlo (-61.97%), New Mexico Ballet Theatre (-62.98%), Ballet Tucson (-64.62%), Oakland Ballet Company (-65.56%), American Contemporary Ballet (-73.01%), and Ballet Palm Beach (-78.00%).



#### **Section III:**

### Operational Definitions, Methodology, and Limitations

#### **Operational Definitions**

#### **Ballet Company**

For this study, DDP defines "ballet company" as an organization that has roots in classical ballet and is a professional performing company. DDP also considers factors such as if the organization teaches pointework to an affiliated school, and if a company commissions choreography that its peer companies perform.

New York City Ballet and PHILADANCO! consider their affiliated school separate from their company. Their total functional expenses and rank would list as higher if their school was included.

Alvin Ailey American Dance Theatre, Dallas Black Dance Theatre, LA Dance Project, and PHILADANCO! also ranked in The Largest US Contemporary and Modern Dance Companies report as they fit multiple definitions and their scope of work is broad. DDP also takes into consideration how a company defines itself. Per their request, Hubbard Street Dance Chicago has been excluded from this study since 2022, instead, HSDC is ranked only in our modern & contemporary report.

DDP remains open-minded with the definition of "ballet" as we recognize the art form is constantly evolving.

#### Methods

Anaheim Ballet

DDP primarily uses proprietary software to extract information from E-filed Form 990s available publicly by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Third-party databases of Form 990 data were also used, gathered by the software or DDP's research team.<sup>15</sup> Following initial data collection of the Largest 160 companies, companies were also contacted to verify FYs 2020 and 2021 total expenditures information. <sup>16</sup> Texture Ballet Company most recently reported 2020 total functional expenses at \$167,698, a change from the previously reported number of \$157,698.



#### **Discrepancies from Previous Reports**

There may be changes in ranking and expenditure calculations by category from DDP's 2022 **Largest 150 US Ballet and Classically Based Companies** but this is due to the shift in rankings of companies. For this report, 4 new ballet companies were added: Eglevsky Ballet, Golden State Ballet, New Orleans Ballet Theatre, and Ballet Tucson. In addition, all calculations made in the report are according to their FY 2021 rankings.

#### Limitations

#### **Fiscal Data**

Golden State Ballet is excluded from 2018, 2019, and 2020 calculations as they were founded in 2021.

The Rosin Box Project is excluded from 2018 and 2019 calculations as they became a nonprofit organization in 2020.

Ballet North Texas is excluded from this year's rankings as their 2020 expenses were reported at \$0. DDP was unable to verify this.

#### **Fiscal Year**

Fiscal years start and end on different dates depending on the company. The discrepancy can affect the functional expenses reported due to the changing restrictions of COVID-19 as companies return to their normal activity, particularly for productions such as The Nutcracker. For example, New York City Ballet's budget year is calculated from July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2021, capturing the 2020 *Nutcracker* season, whereas American Ballet Theatre's budget year is calculated from January 1, 2021, to December 31, 2021, primarily capturing the 2021 *Nutcracker* season.

#### **Structure of Ballet Companies**

There are many differences in the relationship between ballet companies and schools that can affect the output. For example, New York City Ballet is a separate entity from its affiliated school, the School of American Ballet. Likewise, PHILADANCO! has a separate affiliated school. In comparison, other companies, particularly smaller ones may see the majority of their expenses accounted for by their school.

Dayton Ballet was excluded from this data as they are affiliated with the Dayton Performing Arts Alliance. This structure encompasses the Dayton Philharmonic, Dayton Ballet, and Dayton Opera as a single entity.






